**Objective : - Adverbs of manner
-Past continuous**

Adverbs of manner are used to describe verbs

and tell how the action is done.

Example : Mary eats quickly.

describes



verb

In this sentence quickly is the adverb. It gives more information about the verb eats.

It tells us how Mary eats.

- We usually add (-ly) to adjectives to form the adverb.

Example : slow → slowly

careful → carefully

happy (drop the (y) and replace it with (i), then add (ly) → happily

Remember ! these adjectives are irregular:

good → well

fast → fast

hard → hard

- We put the adverb of manner after the verb.
